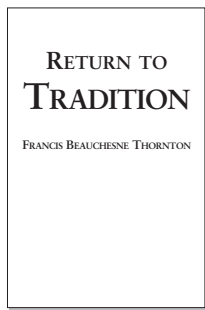

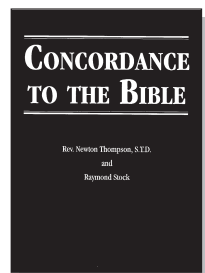

The finest Catholic writing of the past two centuries in this big anthology

Amid the present decline of Catholic life and letters it seems astonishing to recall that in 1948, when this magnificent treasury was published, the Church was enjoying a great literary and intellectual revival that had been going on since the early 1800s. Fr. Thornton divides his survey into five expansive sections: “The English Revival” (including works by Newman, Frederick Faber, Robert Hugh Benson, Belloc, Chesterton, Knox, Sheed, and Waugh)... “The French Influence” (works by Claudel, Gheon, Mauriac, Gilson, Bernanos, Maritain, et al)... “The Irish Revival” (Padraic Colum, James Clarence Mangan, Canon Sheehan)... “The American Revival” (Orestes Brownson, John La Farge, Joyce Kilmer, William Thomas Walsh, Fulton Sheen)...and “The Liturgical Revival” (not to be confused with the upheaval after Vatican II, and including works by Karl Adam, Pius Parsch, Romano Guardini).

The late Catholic author Ralph McInerny, recalled that *Return to Tradition* “conveyed the thought that the American Catholic was, through his faith, connected with the mainstream of Western culture.”

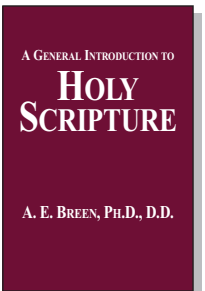

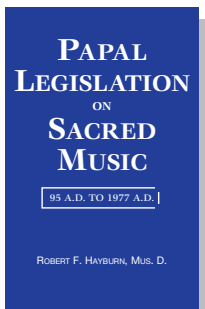
